HOW DO WE KNOW WE HAVE A QUALITY PROGRAM?

A full day introduction to the **ECERS-R** (Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale - Revised), **ITERS-R** (Infant-Toddler Environmental Rating Scale - Revised) and The School Aged Environmental Rating Scale. We will look at the basic principles of what makes quality childcare, and at why using **ECERS-R**, **ITERS-R**, and/or **SACERS** can help us achieve quality. We will give an overview of the terminology used, the scales and how to score them with a little video practice. People involved with Family Child Care may also find this interesting and useful if they want to use the Family Day Care Environmental Rating Scales—Revised.

Presenter Elizabeth Hicks has been working in child care for 25 years. She currently works as an independent consultant and supports early childhood practitioners in thinking about their programs and their goals for children.
