HOW DO WE KNOW WE HAVE A QUALITY PROGRAM?

A full day introduction to the **ECERS-R** (Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale - Revised), **ITERS-R** (Infant-Toddler Environmental Rating Scale - Revised) and The School Aged Environmental Rating Scale. We will look at the basic principles of what makes quality childcare, and at why using **ECERS-R**, **ITERS-R**, and/or **SACERS** can help us achieve quality. We will give an overview of the terminology used, the scales and how to score them with a little video practice. People involved with Family Child Care may also find this interesting and useful if they want to use the Family Child Care Environmental Rating Scales—Revised.
